

THE FOUR SEASONS

Antonio Vivaldi (1678-1741) and Astor Piazzolla (1921-1992)

Vivaldi's *Four Seasons* are the most famous violin concertos in the history of music. The abundance of contrasts makes it a work that perfectly meets the criteria of Baroque music.

But what intrigued the 18th century audience more are the mimicries, which are very present in the *Four Seasons*. Throughout the four concertos, one believes to hear the sound of birds, a thunderstorm rumbling, rain, wind or the heaviness of a hot summer.
