Thanks to a light and mobile scenography, the protagonists themselves stage-manage the show and allow the audience to take part in the story.

Carried by the voices of talented young actors from Ensatt and the soloists and musicians of Les Nouveaux Caractères, this show allows us to rediscover Mozart's sublime and expressive music through the great arias of his opera and to discover the vaudevilles, those short songs integrated into the dialogue, essential for creating the comic and festive atmosphere of Beaumarchais' play.
